Multi Agencies Partnerships

We aim to work alongside a wide range of people involved in our community to support and promote our children's learning, and to create positive transitions for our children.

All areas of learning and development can be supported through these opportunities and enable our children to become;

Unique children; competent, resilient, capable, confident and self-assured.

Positive in their Relationships; strong and independent, secure in their relationships.

Enabling Relationships; our multi agency partnerships enable us to provide an environment, enriched in learning and development opportunities to support learning.

Learning and Development; adaptable confident to learn and develop in different ways, and all areas of learning promoted and considered equally important and inter-connected.

All our children have their own unique educational and developmental needs, it is the role of the staff at the preschools, to understand and respect our children's individuality and provide for their learning accordingly.

It may be necessary at times for some of our children to be further supported by specialist practitioners such as; Teachers of the Deaf, Psychologists, Speech and Language practitioners etc...

It is our aim to work closely with these multi agencies to ensure best practice, to enable our children and their families to access the full range of services that are available as they are required.

Providing staff and key workers with the skills and expertise necessary to enable appropriate care and support for the child.

Our commitment is to work closely with parents as partners in their children's learning. Ensures that they are fully involved in, any decisions or processes made towards working with any agencies, which will support their child's learning and development, at our setting.

All information shared with any multi agency team will be confidential, and permission will have been sought from the parent/carer beforehand.



The rules of confidentiality and data protection will be respected. With parents and staff working closely together to ensure that the child's and family's needs are fully met.

In order that we may encourage our children to feel part of an extended community, it is important that we establish links with outside agencies. Enabling opportunities for us all to interact and learn from each other.

Police, Health workers such as Dentists, Fire Officers, Librarians etc. all play a part in promoting their service to us and supporting the children in their learning about themselves and the world around them.

The preschool, working closely with schools and reception classes, mother and toddler groups, parents and other childcare practitioners; ensures that our children are fully supported and can make smooth and positive transitions both into and out of the preschool as required.

We are aware that our children come to us with a varied Cultural Capital (essential knowledge that children need to prepare them for their future success) our aim is to ensure that when our children leave the setting and transition into school, they do so enriched in new experiences which will increase their knowledge and understanding of the world around them.

Our commitment to inviting outside agencies to come into our setting and work alongside staff and children, bringing in and encouraging new skills and learning opportunities. Is an invaluable tool in helping us achieve and promote these 5 positive outcomes, for example from time to time;



We encourage our parents to come in with their skills to work alongside the children, to extend their learning and development opportunities.

Visits from local library service, fire and police service and Health professionals, help to extend our children's learning experiences.

We also support students from local schools and colleges; enabling them to come and learn from us about child development, whilst sharing their ideas and bringing in their own unique personality into the setting.

A wide variety of opportunities to listen, communicate and interact with a range of 'safe' adults enables our children to become confident and competent learners.

We work closely in partnerships with professionals to enable our children and their families to receive the right services at the right time.

Risk assessments are in place to enable visits to the setting from all our partnerships to happen safely.
